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

City of Dallas Code Compliance

Did you know code compliance is responsible for enforcing more than 900 ordinances related to housing, zoning, signs, litter, illegal dumping, weeds, premise parking, and animal control violations? Here are 3 of the top compliance issues:

- Mandatory watering guidelines—watering is prohibited during any type of precipitation, as well as between April 1-Oct 31 between 10 AM and 6 PM.
- Obstructions—the occupant or owner is responsible for keeping the street, alley, sidewalk and public grounds clear of obstructions.
- Brush collection/bulky trash—no material may be placed out front earlier than the 7 AM on the Thursday prior to collection week and must be in place by 7 AM the Monday of the pick up week.

Code compliance violations can be reported by calling 3-1-1.


