I. Call Meeting to Order - The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by Denise Requardt

- II. Approval of October 2020 General Meeting Minutes Motion made by Cynthia Michaels and seconded by Barb Nunn. Minutes were approved.
- III. Southwest DPD Officer Neighborhood Safety / Crime Updates Officer Wohlwend and Officer Hill and Officer Lambert. Crime stats for the neighborhood and when you should contact 311 vs. 911. Assault with deadly Weapon at the Kroger at 8:55 p.m. on January 5th, green sweater with hair bun and pulled out a knife and told her to get back in the restroom. He ended up fleeing and the victim was unarmed. Assault at Pratt, vandalism on windows at apartments. Animal cruelty 414 West Louisiana, male threatened to assault the dog when the girlfriend broke up with him; DWI arrest on S. Zang; recovery of stolen car on W. Illinois; robbery at donut store on Illinois; Burger King assault on employee behind the counter and stole a bag of food on the counter; theft at apartments off Argentina; arrest for unlawful carrying of weapon at 7-11.

Call 311 – chronic speeding issues – will be sent to speed racing task force. Parking violations, loose animal if it is not aggressive. Homeless encampments, calls will be routed to Homeless Solutions; if you need extra patrols also call 311. Drug complaints are also 311 because the more the complaint is documented, it will go to the narcotics department and they will deal with it.

Call 911 when you hear gunshots, even if it is 4th of July, New Year's Eve, etc. Officers do respond and canvas the area and the helicopter units will canvas the area as well. Phyllis Otto advised there were shots fired in the neighborhood and she did not believe officers came out in response to the 911 call. Officer Wohlwend advised that there was a patrol car sent but it possibly went down the wrong block. He does not believe it is an ongoing issue.

Speeding/Racing/Donuts - call 911

Lynn LaCaze asked if there were any cameras at Zang and Illinois that would capture the racing that goes on there. Officer Wohlwend advised there is not currently a camera at that location.

Any update on the robbery at Lulu's – no update yet. Lulu's employees were duct-taped and robbed. Officers arrived and they were pursued but escaped in a Silver Camry. They have a media bulletin out on them.

IV. Guest Speaker – Chad West, City Council District 1 Enrique MacGregor - guest Violeta Gallarado – guest - Elmwood Co-President

Majority of his time has been getting residents registered for Covid-19 vaccine.

The most calls he receives concerns gunshots and speed racers/donuts. The council passed an ordinance charging you if you are there watching the racers. They are looking at a lot of ways to try and deal with it such as calming traffic lanes.

Public safety issues including speed racing.

Oak Farms Master Plan – big development coming in. DISD is looking at putting in a performing arts center.

Zoning/Neighborhood Centers/ - invest in better lighting and sidewalks and infrastructure; have better community involvement

West Oak Cliff Plan – lack of protected neighborhoods. Fear that developers will consolidate lots, etc. They are establishing at 15-member task force comprised of all stake holders.

Discussion of Tyler Station Development Early stages (2+ year process) No zoning plan at this time Need to be sensitive to displacement Need extensive community involvement

Neighborhood questions: Zebra bumps are not working Add streetlights Increase in graffiti
