


From the Board

Update for the Parks at Wynnewood

The senior housing is entering it's final months of construction. According to the Banc of America, we may be able to host our next general meeting there for a tour of the facilities. Stay tuned for more information.

P hase II will be composed of family housing and will be located next to the Empowerment Center on the opposite side of Zang. Banc of America's proposal for Phase II jumped up the state's priority/authorization list due to good neighborhood efforts, sound proposals, and a little luck. It's likely that may begin next year, and if you haven't noticed, rezoning signs have already been posted. The family development will be a little more dense than the senior living center and will bring us another step closer to a potential release of acreage from the LURA and new development in our section of Oak Cliff.
